This is one of our favorite rest stops on the East Proctor Loop. The bench looks over a small grassland and trees to Madera Creek and Mt. Wrightson beyond. Sit here for a few minutes and let the distant sound of the water soothe, the afternoon sun wash the mountain ridge with color, and the occasional deer pass you by. Carpenter bees (beneficial pollinators) may be busy behind you on the bench's bee board.
